Tennessee Wars Commission Grant Supports Johnsonville State Historic Park Grant funds materials to tell park Civil War stories.

New Johnsonville, Tenn. - The Tennessee Wars Commission, the Tennessee Historical Commission program devoted to preserving the state's significant military history, has funded the purchase of several items to tell the Civil War stories of Johnsonville, TN. These items include the purchase of a reproduction 1861 Springfield Musket, Blackpowder and a reproduction artillery tube to be used for firing demonstrations through the Tennessee Wars Commission Grant Fund (TWCGF).

This project is funded under a Grant Contract with the State of Tennessee, Tennessee Historical Commission, Tennessee Wars Commission and the Department of Environment and Conservation funded by the Wars Commission Grant Fund.

The Tennessee Wars Commission Grant provides funding for the preservation, protection, promotion, and interpretation of Tennessee's military heritage ranging from the French and Indian War through the American Civil War. Since 1994, this grant program has funded over one hundred different projects preserving and

interpreting the military legacy of Tennessee and Tennesseans. "The Wars Commission grant fund is an opportunity for Tennessee communities to enhance their war-related history through the preservation, acquisition, interpretation, and archaeology, of sites and structures related to the various wars, furthering our collective knowledge of these historical sites and events," said Wars Commission Program Director, Nina Scall. Johnsonville State Historic Park preserves, protects, and shares the stories of Johnsonville, TN (1864-
